Queen's Drive Infant School Uniform Policy

We **encourage** all our children to wear their uniform smartly. All items must be labelled. It consists of the following:

- Royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan
- White polo shirt (with school logo if preferred)
- Black/grey tailored trousers/ skirt/ shorts/ pinafore
- Black/grey/white socks/tights
- Black shoes

(optional: During the Summer term children can wear blue/ white checked dress)

The role of the Governors

The Governing body supports the Headteacher in implementing the school uniform policy. It is the governors responsibility that uniform meets all regulations under the Equal Opportunities Act.

We make sure the uniform is hard wearing, safe and practical.

Our school has a duty to make sure that the uniform we require is affordable, in line with statutory guidance from the Department for Education on the cost of school uniform.

All children will be expected to attend school in PE kit on their PE days.

- white t-shirt, (school logo optional)
- Navy jogging pants/leggings/shorts
- Navy jogging top (school logo optional)

Designer labelled clothes and clothes with other logos/pictures **should not** feature.

Jewellery

For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear jewellery. The exceptions are stud earrings and small objects of religious significance. Children are required to remove all jewellery during PE lessons. Please note that teachers are not allowed to remove earrings.

Hair and Makeup

Make up and nails varnish should not be worn to school. Extreme hairstyles are not appropriate for school.
